## CALL FOR ABSTRACTS OF CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS, SYMPOSIUMS, ORAL PAPER PRESENTATION AND POSTERS.

Authors are invited to submit their abstracts for Pre-conference workshops, Symposia, Free Paper/Poster sessions at the 48<sup>th</sup>NACIACP. All abstracts accepted for the conference will be published in the conference proceedings. The abstracts should be typed in English language, font size 12, font type Times New Roman, line spacing 1.5, word limit 150-200 and in MS word format. The abstracts should comply with the following format: Title of study, Names of author, co-author/s, designations, qualifications and institutional affiliations; contact details, aim, methodology, summary of results, conclusions and 3- 5 keywords. Additionally, for free paper/poster sessions: Specify name of presenter. For Pre-Conference workshop: Specify number of facilitators, minimum and maximum number of participants, duration of workshop in hours (3/6) and objectives to be achieved.

**For symposium:** Specify name of the proposer. Number of presenters can range from 2 to 5. Individual abstracts are not required to be submitted for each presenter. Individual topic/area of presentation, however, has to be stated for each participant and objectives to be achieved.

Please DO NOT send hard copies. Only registered delegates are permitted to make presentations. Last date for submission of abstracts is 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021.

#### S.C. Gupta Best Paper Award:

Full papers are invited for S.C. Gupta Best Paper Award. The three best papers will be selected. The authors of these three papers will have to make a presentation in the conference. The other papers, if selected, will be accommodated in free paper presentation sessions. Guidelines for full paper submission for S. C. Gupta Best Paper Award:

To be eligible for the award the paper must fulfil each of the following criteria.

- $\Psi$  It must be a research paper based on work done in India.
- $\Psi$  It must not have been published in a scientific Journal nor received any other award.
- $\Psi$  The First author shall be an IACP member and at least 50% of all authors must be members of the IACP at the time of the submission and presentation of the proposal.
- $\Psi$  For submission format, visit www.iacp.in and follow 'Instructions for authors' for paper submission in IJCP.

Last date for S. C. Gupta best paper award is 15th December, 2021. All entries should be sent to 'The Chairperson, Award Committee'.

## Place of interests in Madurai



#### MEENAKSHI AMMAN TEMPLE

One Of the many attractions that make South India a cultural paradise on earth, Meenakshi Temple is the most iconic and popular one. Located on the southern bank of the Vaigai River in Madurai, this Hindu temple is an epitome of classic architecture with murals so gorgeous that it will take your breath away.



#### The Thousand Pillar Mandapam

It is regared as the 'wonder of the palace'. There are around 985 beautifully decorated columns. Each pillar is beautifully sculptured and presents the glory of the Dravidan sculpture. This hall also houses a Temple Art Museum, where you can see icons, photographs, drawings, etc., exhibiting the 1200 years old history. Other than this mandapam there many smaller and bigger mandapams in the temple.



#### Gandhi Memorial Museum

Holy city of Madurai has played a crucial role in the life of Mahatma Gandhi and his fight against many oddities of our country and the colonial system. It was here, where Mahatma Gandhi entered the magnificent Meenakshi Temple with Harijans, which was a historic step in his fight against untouchability. Gandhi Memorial Museum symbolizes this and many other important facets of Mahatma Gandhi's life.

#### Samanar Hills

Located in Keelakuyilkudi village which is around 12 km away from Madurai, Samanar hills are beautiful blend of nature with history. Also known as Samanar Malai as the Tamil word Malai means hills, it boasts of ancient caves with carvings dating back to 1st century A.D. These hills are associated to Jainism with Tamil-Brahmi inscriptions depicting various facets of the religion.





#### Keeladi

Artefacts which are found in excavations carried out at Keeladi have confirmed a possible link between the scripts of the Indus Valley Civilisation and Tamil Brahmi, which is said to be the precursor to modern Tamil. Yet another major discovery states that the Vaigai riverbed had an urban civilization that was cotemporary to the Gangetic plain civilization.



#### Thirumalai Nayak Palace

An artistic blend of Dravidian and Islamic styles, Thirumalai Nayak Palace is a place worth admiring and exploring when on a Madurai Tour. It was built in 1635, by the King Thirumalai Nayak who had the vision of creating a masterpiece for royal stay. It was designed as a residence for the king by an Italian architect.
